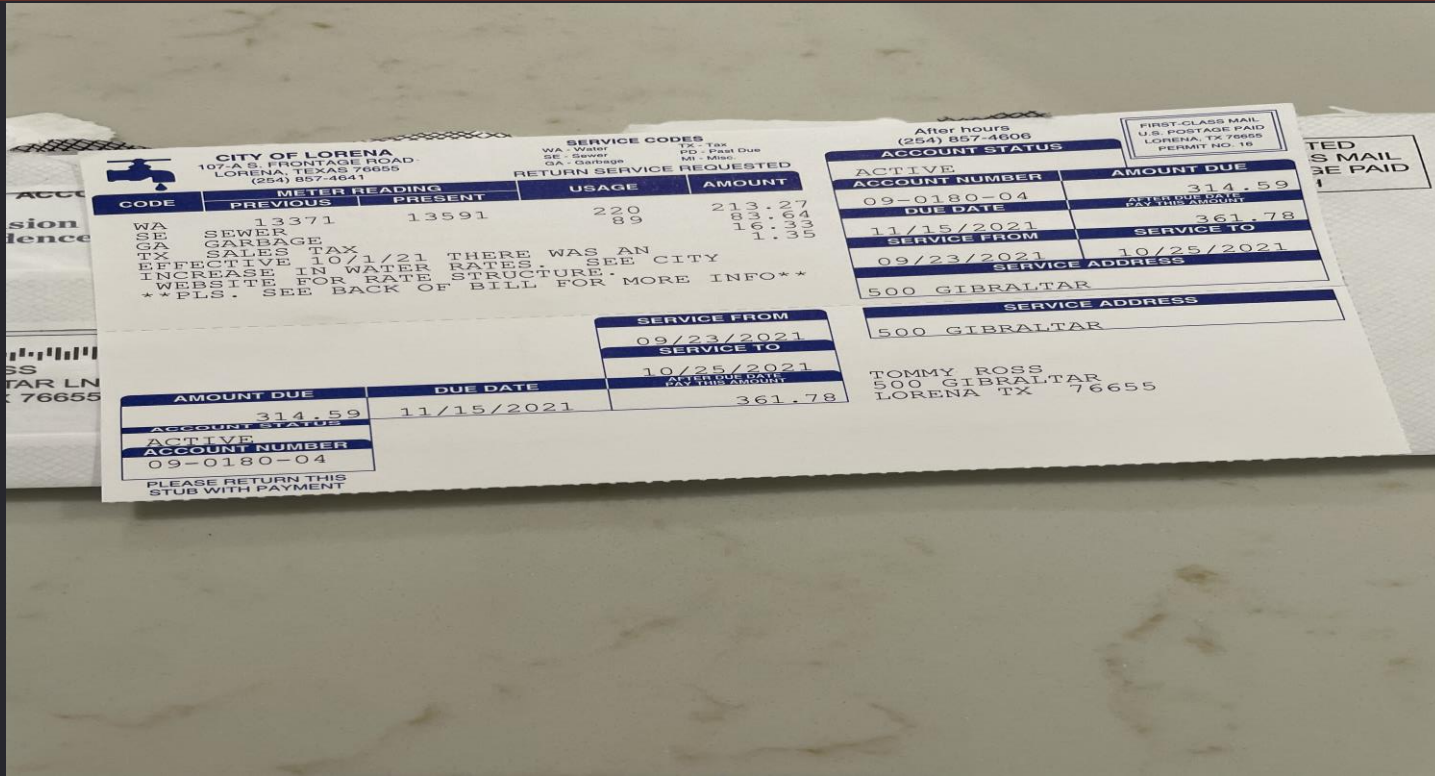

# Streets and Infrastructure

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- Repair Streets
- Two Options:
  - 1) no change in the tax rate
  - 2) roughly a .10 increase in the current rate from .53 to .63
- ( On a \$250,000 house it would increase it roughly \$250 per year)
